- Position** The College of Public Health and Human Sciences invites applications for a 12-month, full-time Endowed Director of the newly formed Moore Family Center for Whole Grain Foods, Nutrition & Preventive Health. A generous private endowment was recently established to create this Center including funds for this position and infrastructure for an enthusiastic leader to move the Center forward. The director will participate in shaping the structure, goals, and objectives of the Center, allowing the rare opportunity to have an active hand to shape its operation into an internationally recognized research organization. Salary is competitive and commensurate with the candidates' experience. The anticipated start date is June 16, 2012, or as soon thereafter as convenient.
- Responsibilities** The Center director will have the responsibility to lead and mentor faculty and build multi-disciplinary teams to address critical issues surrounding foods and health promotion. The director will build upon current strengths and opportunities to maximize the capacity of this Center. The director will also liaise with and catalyze interactions among other existing centers in the college and across campus, including the Hallie E. Ford Center for Healthy Children and Families and the Center for Healthy Aging Research. The Center will conduct high quality research, translate research into practice, and build the capacities of communities to enhance the health of individuals and families.
- Qualifications** The successful candidate will have an established history of and active engagement in funded scholarship, demonstrated evidence of collaborative leadership, strong commitments to the application and translation of research, an appreciation for broad intellectual inquiry and methods, and a demonstrable commitment to promoting and enhancing diversity. The candidate will have the academic background and expertise to meet expectations of Full Professor with indefinite tenure in an academic unit within the College. A PhD in Nutrition, Public Health or related discipline is required. Desirable characteristics include having experience in multidisciplinary approaches that integrate basic sciences, behavior and translation to the community. Examples of desired expertise areas include foods and food behavior, community-based and/or multi-level nutrition interventions, public health nutrition, nutrition epidemiology and health policy.
- School and College** The School of Biological & Population Health Sciences is one of two schools in the College of Public Health & Human Sciences, the other being the School of Social & Behavioral Health Sciences. The School comprises graduate and undergraduate programs in Nutrition and in Exercise & Sport Science, and graduate programs in Biostatistics, Epidemiology, Environment, Health & Safety, and International Health. The Nutrition program offers the didactic program in dietetics as well as the dietetics internship, both of which are CADE-accredited. - The Council on Education in Public Health has given approval to the College to pursue becoming an accredited College of Public Health & Human Sciences. The College is located within OSU's Health Sciences Division along with the OSU Colleges of Pharmacy and Veterinary Medicine. Collaborative research across disciplines is fostered within the College and with faculty of other colleges and institutions. As a Carnegie Engaged institution, the College's innovative Outreach Collaboratives for Healthy Oregon (OCHO) encompasses the College's Extension Family and Community Health and 4-H Youth Development among other outreach programs, and forges successful partnerships between county extension offices and county health departments for public health and human sciences practice improvement.

In addition, OSU Extension Family and Community Health Program serves thousands of Oregonians across the state. The Extension program is a natural fit for this Center with a statewide network working toward a healthier Oregon. Outside the college, OSU has additional resources and collaborations with many other units, including the Dept of Food Science and Technology and the Linus Pauling Institute.
